

## IN MEMORIAM

In August, Brother Timothy Nicholas Tomasello's widow, Karen Tomasello, notified Columbia Brotherhood Lodge No. 370 that Brother Timothy Nicholas Tomasello, Born June 14, 1954, laid down his tools on October 17, 2024, at the age of 70 years, 4 months, and 13 days and having completed 48.6 years of Masonic Service.

He was initiated on September 29, 1975, passed on January 26, 1976, and raised on March 22, 1976, in Alta Vista Lodge No. 464.

Since he was raised, Alta Vista Lodge No 464 consolidated with Argonne Lodge No 461 in 1983 to form Columbia Lodge No. 461 which consolidated with Balder Lodge No. 393 in 1987 to form Columbia Balder Lodge No. 393 which consolidated with Parnassus-Presidio Lodge No. 388 in 1990 to form Columbia No. 388 and then consolidated with Brotherhood No. 370 in 2005 to form Columbia Brotherhood No. 370.

# Grand Master's Decision: Esoteric or Secret Portion of the Ritual

Most Worshipful Arthur L. Salazar was asked to clarify the secrete portion of the ritual. His analysis and decision are provided below.

#### (2025 G.M. Decision No. 1)

I have been asked to clarify the meaning of the phrase "esoteric or secret portion" of the Ritual as referenced in the *California Masonic Code* ("CMC").

Understanding the secrets of Freemasonry is crucial, as each of us has taken an obligation to safeguard them. It is deemed unmasonic conduct to reduce them to writing. To address this question, I have collaborated with the Executive Committee, the Ritual Committee, and the Jurisprudence Committee to develop a comprehensive answer, which is provided in the form of Grand Master's Decision No. 1. Prior to 1988, the Ritual was transmitted orally, "from

mouth to ear," with no written document containing the complete Ritual. This oral tradition was regarded as emphasizing the experiential nature of, and safeguarding, the secrets of Freemasonry. Recognizing the need for a standardized approach, the Grand Lodge adopted a resolution in 1988 permitting the use of a cipher — later specifically, the Allen cipher, produced by Allen Publishing Company in Virginia and utilized widely in the United States since at least 1907. In 1991, the Grand Lodge adopted the version titled "King Solomon and His Travelers," a cipher book that

includes both plain English portions and ciphered

portions of the Ritual.

While one might assume that anything encoded or in cipher is automatically secret, that is not the case. For example, when an officer is asked whether a candidate is prepared, the first response is in plain English, while the second is in cipher—yet both are the same words. By a careful examination of the cipher, however, we can discern that portion which is esoteric or secret. Every word in cipher is represented either by a few letters of the word or a symbol or code for that word. Critically, however, I note that the words, grips and tokens which we consider modes of recognition are "not" in the cipher, in code or otherwise, except in one instance. While the due guards and signs (and a token in the one instance) are referenced using a few letters of each word in a phrase, those letters are not sufficiently descriptive of how the sign is made for the reader to render the sign. The steps and the Points of Fellowship are necessarily explained in more detail in the cipher, but they are also modes of recognition, which are secret.

It is therefore my decision that the signs, words or modes of recognition in our Ritual – which means our due guards, signs, words, grips, tokens, steps, and the Points of Fellowship – are the "esoteric or secret portion" of the Ritual.

This interpretation aligns with our longstanding understanding of Masonic secrets and the principle that their safeguard is fundamental to our integrity and obligations, and any unauthorized disclosure—written or otherwise—would compromise the very essence of Freemasonry.

This decision takes immediate effect. I will present it at the next Annual Communication. Should the Masters, Wardens, and other delegates approve this decision, the following narrative will be added to the appendix of the *California Masonic Code* in which the Grand Master's interpretative decisions are recorded.

### **Masonic Formation Class**

Each candidate for blue Lodge degrees is required to



demonstrate proficiency in each degree which is conferred upon him and is promised suitable assistance to do so. Prospects and candidates for the Entered Apprentice Degree can be assisted

when social and moral behaviors and Masonic culture are introduced through a mentoring process. Attending *Continued on Page 7*

Masonic Formation Class (MFC) meetings assists prospects, candidates, and Brothers who are working on all three Blue-Lodge degrees. Participants are encouraged to ask questions about Freemasonry and how our "Craft" can assist them in their lives. Some of the best questions are those which come "organically" from participants, and presentations on a variety of topics associated with Freemasonry are provided to encourage further participant discussion.

As Grand Master Salazar indicated in the above, prior to 1988, the ritual was provided mouth to ear after which the California Grand Lodge adopted a series of Cipher books to be used in conjunction with one-on-one coaching and to assist candidates in memorizing the ritual. California Lodges also provided coaching guided by the <a href="Handbook for Candidates Coaches">Handbook for Candidates Coaches</a>, which was first published in <a href="1962">1962</a> by the California Grand Lodge Committee on Ritual.

During the last decade, Columbia Brotherhood Lodge (CBL) provided regularly scheduled MFC meetings open to prospects, degree candidates and Brothers working on proficiencies for their current degrees.

As one might expect, fully engaging a group with a broad range of experience or degree levels requires more than reviewing the lecture of a single degree, so the CBL program is set up as a forum which encourages a general discussion of Masonic principles and symbolism, and topics have been selected and conducted to honor the obligations to protect secrets and esoteric parts of our craft.

The last hour of the MFC meetings provides opportunities for those working on their proficiencies to receive assistance. When more than one participant is working on a proficiency in the same degree at the same time the work can be done as a group, or a Brother can schedule a specific appointment for proficiency assistance.

The Grand Master's 2025 decision No. 1 has raised questions about the MFC Meeting process. Given the specificity of that which is considered secret actually provides much more latitude for future discussion than that which was exercised in the past.

After a hiatus in July, MFC meetings resumed on August 11<sup>th</sup> and August 18<sup>th</sup>. Those in attendance included prospects, an applicant for the entered apprentice degree, entered apprentices, a

Fellowcraft Mason, and Master Masons. The topics of conversation included participant questions, Columbia-Brotherhood-constituent-Lodge history, the symbolism of the Master's hat, the Hiram Award, Officers' duties and the concept of Advanced Stations, selected historic Masonic events which occurred in August, and Freemasonry's involvement in Public Education

MFC Meetings are planned for September 8th and September 15th and discussion topics include participant questions, selected historical Masonic events which occurred in September, the concept of exemplary, virtuous thoughts and behaviors in comparison ruffian thoughts and behaviors, and symbolism associated with certain Lodge elements.





#### HAVE YOU BEEN LISTENING? TRIVIA

- Three Core Principles of Freemasonry are <u>Brotherly love</u>, Relief, and Truth.
- 2. The "Circumpunct" has also been referred to as a **Point** in a Circle.
- Many of our Lodge brothers supported Masons4Mitts on Saturday August 9<sup>th</sup> to watch the San Francisco Giants play the Washington Nationals play ball.
- 4. Alta Vista Lodge No 464 consolidated with Argonne Lodge No 461 in 1983 to form <u>Columbia</u> Lodge No. 461.
- In Freemason history, the Premier Grand Lodge of England was generally considered to have been founded on <u>June 24</u>, <u>1717</u>.
- 6. The Lodge of the Goose and <u>Gridiron</u> Ale House, the Lodge of the Crown Ale House, the Lodge of the of the Apple Tree Tavern and the Lodge of the Rummer and Grapes Tavern gathered at the Goose and Gridiron Alehouse on June 24, 1717, and declared themselves a Grand Lodge.
- 7. This Grand Lodge was called the **<u>Premier</u>** Grand Lodge of England.
- 8. Anthony Sayer was elected the first **Grand** Master of the Premier Grand Lodge of England.
- The Premier Grand Lodge published the "Constitutions of the Free-Masons" by James Anderson, the first comprehensive rulebook for modern Freemasonry, further solidifying its structure and principles and it was called the <u>Anderson</u> Constitutions of 1723.
- The 1723 edition of the Constitutions was edited and reprinted by Benjamin Franklin in Philadelphia in <u>1734</u>, becoming the first Masonic book printed in America.

#### Answers to August 2025 Trivia

- On August 4th, 1753, George <u>Washington</u> received his Master Mason Degree in Fredericksburg Lodge, Virginia.
- August 5th, 1884, Freemasons laid the cornerstone for the <u>Statue</u> of Liberty.
- 3. The Master's Jewel is a **Square**.
- 4. Each Masonic Blue Lodge has **three** movable jewels.
- 5. The Grand Lodge of Panama was established in 1917.
- One of the <u>symbols</u> of a Lodge is the dark and light checkerboard pattern.
- Lodge officers preparing for leadership roles for the ensuing Masonic year is referred to as <u>Advanced</u> Stations.
- 8. n 1907, Parnassus was chartered as Lodge No. 388.
- The Three Steps usually delineated upon the Master's carpet, are emblematical of the three principal stages of <u>human</u> life.
- 10. The Grand Lodge of California will hold the <u>176<sup>th</sup></u> Annual Communication Meeting October 24<sup>th</sup> through 26, 2025.


