"Independence Day (Pilipino: "Day of Freedom") is an annual national holiday in the Philippines observed on June 12, commemorating the Philippine Declaration of Independence from Spain on June 12, 1898. Since 1962, it has been the country's National Day.

Philippine Independence, as a celebration in America, has gained cultural awareness prominently after the 21st century began. Philippine Independence Day is widely celebrated by many to rekindle their roots and heritage.

San Francisco celebrates Philippine Independence Day annually at Union Square. The Philippine flag is raised at the San Francisco City hall every June 12 as a commemoration of the event and for San Francisco's large Filipino."

On June 7 on our stated meeting dinner I encourage everyone to wear, The **Barong Tagalog**, or simply **Barong**, is an embroidered formal shirt and considered the national dress of the Philip-

pines. It is lightweight and worn untucked over an undershirt.

In the last two years we have had the Filipino American students from Dominican University performed the Tinikling, the Philippine national dance. Unfortunately this year they are unable to perform for us, but we have obtained a surprise performer for us.



A History of US Freemasonry

THE ROLE of Freemasonry and individual Masons prior to and through the American Revolution was not one of unity and harmony with the Crown or the ancient regime of the Church. Speaking generally, in the ancient regime the church and state mutually supported each other in maintaining their respective places of predominance and privilege. Liberalism and liberals, which included Freemasonry and Masons, were declared to be traitorous by the state, and heretical and atheistic by the Church.

With the victorious end of the American Revolution, Masonic philosophy had, for the first time, an opportunity to play a constructive role in the erection of a political and social order. The experience of Masonic organizations before the Modern Age had taught Masons that liberty for the individual has never been handed down by the government-- liberty is gained through the limitation of the powers of government. Masons had also discovered that freedoms are learned---the individual has freedom of thought only as he learns to move within the limits established by a rational intelligence; he has freedom to form opinions only after he has learned to distinguish “Fact from Fiction”; he has social freedom only after he has learned to live according to accepted standards of social established social norms; he has political freedom to the extent to which the law protects his political rights; and he has freedom to extend his liberties only when he has learned to fulfill obligations and conditions of those liberties. Masons have long recognized that: “The discovery of the power to aim at ideals ends freely chosen by his own will and intelligence is the supreme achievement of man, and in that, more than any other in any other single fact, lies hope of the future.”

Wine

Oil

Corn, wine and oil were the Masonic wages of our ancient brethren.

In ancient operative times, the Master of the Work received the highest wages. His wages were corn, wine, oil and sometimes the coin of the realm. Fellowcraft and Entered Apprentice wages were less than the Master, but they were kept in "mete and drynk" (meat and drink).

In Speculative Freemasonry, Masonic wages are not earned in coin. They are the rewards earned through acts of kindness, and good deeds . "Do unto others as you would HAVE them do unto you."
