"**Brotherly Love**" Next to the word Mother or Father, no word in the English language is

our own. The Happy and Beneficial Effects of our Ancient and Honorable Institution.


Still, no man is perfect; but the Lodge is a moral workshop in which the rough Ashlar is to be polished for use and beauty. If the Lodge had been too exacting, none of us would have gained admission. for membership. In changing a Rough Ashlar into a Perfect Ashlar, the craftsman takes away and never adds to. He chips and chisels. He cuts away the rough edges. He removes the visible flaws. He takes that which is already there and develops it into the Perfect Ashlar.

The stone from which the Venus de Milo was carved by Alexandros of Antioch of ancient times, lay since the beginning of time in the rocks of the Island Milo. A common, unknown workman cut a piece of marble from the quarry to construct her. But it took a master artisan to carve out the beautiful statue. It took a good piece of marble and a skilled artist to produce the Venus de Milo and she is revered even with all her imperfections.

There are not many of us in Masonry that can make a Perfect Ashlar. So, there are not many perfect Masons. We are all a work in progress. In our Ritualistic and other work, we can take away much of the roughness, remove the sharp points and obliterate

many of the visible defects. We can produce as good a Mason, as good a brother, as there is within our power to produce.

So, a Mason should treat his brother who may yet be a little rough; not with bitterness, nor with worldly indifference, nor with philosophic coldness; but with empathy, patience, and loving-kindness. It is our responsibility to call to his attention in the tenderest of manners the sharp points of his character. We must deal faithfully but tenderly, firmly but patiently with such issues.

What will we choose to be; a stumbling block or steppingstone in our Lodge; in our relationships with our Brothers? Are we willing to provide the support that's needed to raise a brother to the next step and remove a few more of the sharp points in the creation of the perfect Ashlar? To lift a brother is one of the highest and most ennobling acts within Freemasonry. By acting like Brothers only then will we be fulfilling our mission of taking good men and making them better. Masonry is most beautiful when use.

Mason Formation Class



On September 4, (or June 5) 1820, James K. Polk (U.S. President 1845-

1849) received his 1st degree in Columbia Lodge #31, Tennessee.





On September 11, 2000 the Grand Masters of the Grand Lodge of D.C. and the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of D.C. signed a ceremonial "proclamation" symbolizing their mutual recognition that had been voted on favorably by both Grand Lodges in 1999

On September 12, 1826 William Morgan, who had published an exposé of Masonic secrets, was taken from the jail in Canandaigua, New

York,

kidnapped, and possibly later murdered. This was the trigger for the Morgan Affair and the Antimasonic movement and Antimasonic Party in the United States from the 1820s through the 1840s.

September 13, 1882 a monument was dedicated in Batavia, New York, to William Morgan, the man whose kidnapping and possible murder by Freemasons started the antimasonic



movement in the United States in 1826. The monument says Morgan was a "martyr to the freedom of writing and printing the truth."

September 14, 1844 the Grand Lodge of Michigan was founded.

September 15, 1851 Grand Lodge of Oregon was formed

September 18, 1793 the cornerstone of the United States Capitol building in Washington D.C. was laid in an elaborate, formal Masonic ceremony, with George Washington personally playing a key role and wearing Masonic regalia.



September 18, 1856 the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Indiana was organized.

September 20, 1784, the Grand Lodge of

England issued a warrant to African Lodge #459. This charter is a prized possession of the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, and African Lodge #459 has continued to exist to the present time.

On September 23, 1857, the Grand Lodge of Nebraska was formed.

On September 25, 1786, the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania was organized

On September 25, 1872, the Shrine of North America (AAONMS) was organized, in New York City.



On September 30, 1949, Gerald R. Ford (38th U.S. President August 9, 1974 – January 20, 1977) received his 1st degree in Malta Lodge #465, Grand Rapids, Michigan. He later said in 1975, "When I took my obligation as a master mason—incidentally, with my three younger brothers—I recalled the value my own father attached to that order. But I had no idea that I would ever be added to the company of the Father of our Country and 12 other members of the order who also served as Presidents

of the United States."^[224] Ford was made a 33° Scottish Rite Mason on September 26, 1962.^[225] In April 1975, Ford was elected by a unanimous vote Honorary Grand Master of the International Supreme Council, Order of DeMolay, a position in which he served until January 1977.^[226] Ford received the de-



grees of York Rite Masonry (Chapter and Council degrees) in a special ceremony in the Oval Office on January 11, 1977, during his term as President of the United States.^[227]

Ford was also a member of the Shriners and the Royal Order of Jesters; both being affiliated bodies of Freemasonry.^[228]
