Due to the resurgence of the Corona-19 pandemic, the emergence of the omicron variants and in the interest of the safety of our brothers and sisters, we must continue to heed CDC and local health department recommendations for minimizing exposure to the several active variants of the Covid 19 virus when we meet in person, and, as a additional precautionary measure the MFC Classes will continue to meet virtually for the time being.

January 31st to February 15th.
As a public holiday, Chinese
people will get 7 days off from work from January 31st to February 6th in 2022.

ruary 1st, 2022, starting a year

The most notable dates of the Chinese Lunar New Year 2022 are these three days:

New Year's Eve on January 31st, 2022

New Year's Day on February 1st, 2022

The Lantern Festival on Febru-

ary 15th, 2022

Traditionally Chinese Lunar New Year activities started as early as three weeks before Chinese New Year's Eve. Old-fashioned (mostly rural) folk start cleaning their houses from the 23rd of the twelfth lunar month (January 25th, 2022).

People born in a year of the Tiger are predicted to be brave, competitive, unpredictable, and confident. They will experience their zodiac birth sign year (benmingnian) in 2022, which is considered bad luck.

The date of Chinese New Year changes every year, but it always falls between January 21st and February 20th.

The date is decided by the Chinese Lunar Calendar,

which is based on cycles of the moon and sun and is generally 21-51 days behind the Gregorian (internationally-used) calendar. Chinese New Year is a new moon day, usually the second after the winter solstice. This month, we will be celebrating a few other events as well. We have planned for our brethren a dinner party with their significant other at our Valentines party on February 12th. it will be followed by an exciting fellowship the next day, February 13th with a Superbowl Party. Both these events will be held at our lodge. You can be informed of all lodge activities by visiting our website and clicking on both tresthboard and calender links.

meet the requirements of the balance of our Grand Master's proclamations and will update you as we proceed, particularly regarding actions that may benefit from your participation.

After the briefing by our inspector WB Allan Nubla, the DSOI attendees participated in and observed an inspector-critiqued 1st degree ritual practice the better to execute a memorable and meaningful degree for Mr. Cyrous Navarrete. He was initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason on January 26, 2022 and is now Brother Cyrous Navarrete. He has begun his 1st degree proficiency work, and we look forward to progress on the completion of his first-degree proficiency.

As part of our studies and journeys as masons, we interact with brothers and sisters from different blue lodges and concordant bodies. Several of us attended the installations of officers for other lodges in the area, particularly those lodges where several of our Columbia Brotherhood Brethren participate and serve as officers. memorize. Which brings us to our "Did You Know"? In terms of the aging brain, you're never too old to learn. The biggest obstacle is a lack of confidence and fear. Then we have all heard, I don't have time. Normal people can memorize.

<u>Understanding the material</u> is important as: 1) At times when one forgets the exact word(s) or goes blank, understanding what one intended to express will carry one through normal memory blocks while maintaining continuity and expressing the meaning of the words lost. 2) Understanding the ritual helps the speaker express and deliver ideas in more than words and enhances the performance.

<u>Practice</u>, as with all things, helps make word delivery and performance more natural. It also provides opportunities to understand and enhance delivery and floor work.

<u>Put on "a good show</u>". Keep in mind that our efforts publicly show our level of commitment. How the actor(s) perform says a lot about the character of the actor(s).

How many times are you willing to see the same Broadway play? Masonic ritual is a play. Plays must entertain, or they will not attract an audience. Masonic ritual is intended and should be taken seriously. Did you know there are opportunities to lighten the mood in our ritual? These should be taken advantage of (Keeping in mind that everyone needs to maintain gentlemanly behavior and nothing we do should detract from the seriousness of the business in which we are engaged).

Last: who are the actors in our play? Everyone! from the Master to the sideliners (even the candidate). Keeping

all this in mind and performing good ritual creates a positive experience for everyone. Good Masonic ritual encompasses Freemasonry, a man and me.

This month of February, we have 3 upcoming events to celebrate such as CHINESE NEW YEAR, our Annual Columbia Brotherhood Valentine's Dinner and Dance and the 2022 Super Bowl Party. So, make sure to sign-up early!

Masonic Formation Class

During the January MFC classes participants discussed Operative Masonry's Apprentice System; Freemasonry's "initiatic" process; the Blue-Lodge application process, Blue Lodge Degrees, and proficiency process; our coaching/mentoring system; Masonry vs. Religion, and belief in a Supreme Being and began planning the night in old Havana which is scheduled for November 12, 2022. This year's event is coupled with a casino night, so the evening will begin with masonic discussions and end with a family casino night.

MFC classes for February are planned to cover Grand Lodge of England, the masonic monitor the Holy Saints John, Secrecy, liberal arts and sciences, and Masonic Symbols. Activities will include a walk about tour of the lodge and continued work on topics and theme for the Night in Old Havana.

The walk about tour will include discussion about the officers of the lodge, their duties and locations in the lodge room.

The Worshipful Master sits in the east and is the leader of the lodge. His jewel is the square which denotes morality.

The Senior Warden sits in the west and assists the Worshipful Master in conducting lodge business while he prepares to take on that position, and his jewel is the level which represents equality.

The Junior Warden sits in the south and supervises the craftsmen when they are at refreshment. On his journey to the Worshipful Master's seat, he assists the Worshipful Master and Senior Warden in the conduct of lodge business and is responsible for ensuring the Craftsmen have the necessary refreshments at stated meetings and other functions. His jewel is the Plumb, and it denotes rectitude of life.

The Treasurer sits at the right of the Worshipful Master in the east and his duties are to ensure that monies he receives from the Secretary are justly and accurately tracked and ensures the money is paid out in accordance with the direction of the Master with the consent of the lodge. His efforts coupled with the success of our brothers who invest our money are instrumental in ensuring the financial health of the lodge, and his jewel is a pair of crossed keys.

The Secretary sits to the left of the master, keeps all records, provides

records to the Grand Lodge when appropriate, ensures that information about the brethren is timely and up to date, collects all monies from the brethren, pays the same to the Treasurer and takes his receipt therefore. His position puts him at the middle of most of the lodge interactions including events in the lives of our brothers. As a result, he alerts the Master, Senior and Junior Wardens of the needs of our brethren and their families and usually the first member of the lodge to official reach out to families who are facing some of life's challenges. His jewel is a pair of crossed quills.

The Chaplain sits to the left of the Master and is responsible for the non-denominational prayers used in the lodge functions, and his jewel is an open book symbolizing a volume of the Sacred Law such as a Bible, Torah, Koran, Veda, or other book which may be held sacred by lodge members.

The Assistant Secretary sits near the Secretary in the lodge, he assists the Secretary with his duties and takes the Secretary's place when needed. His Jewel is a single quill.

The Senior Deacon sits to the right of the Master. He carries messages for

the Master, receives and conducts candidates and introduces and accommodates visiting brethren, and his jewel is the Square laying over Compass with the Sun in the Center.

The Junior Deacon sites to the right of the Senior Warden, carries messages for the Senior warden, carries messages from the Worshipful Master to the Tyler, alerts the Worshipful Master of brothers desiring admission. His jewel is a Square laying over a Compass with a Moon in the center.

The Marshall sits in front of the Secretary. His duties include organizing processions and ensuring appropriate behavior etiquette and precedence during lodge functions. His jewel is the Batton.

The Senior and Junior Stewards assist the Junior Warden in his activities, assist in setting up the lodge room and prepare candidates to receive their degrees. They sit in the South near Junior Warden, and their jewels are cornucopias.

The Tyler sits outside of the Lodge's closed entry door, and he is tasked with preventing cowans and eves droppers from passing into the tiled lodge, with ensuring visitors are "properly clothed," and with preventing latecomers from entering the lodge room until the appropriate time. His jewel is the sward.


