Brothers and sisters,
As we begin our celebrations and observances for May including May Day observing the beginning of summer activities, Cinco de Mayo, and Memorial Day, I send greetings from the West.

According to Order of the Health Officer No. C19-07y, dated June 11, 2021 and updated March 31, 2022 <<https://www.sfdph.org/dph/alerts/files/C19-07-Safer-Return-Together-Health-Order.pdf>>, "There remains the ongoing threat that the [Covid-19] virus, including other future variants or subvariants, pose particularly to the health of medically vulnerable residents...." The Health Officer recommends a well fitted mask when indoor. Our lodge extends the recommendations in this order to wear well fitted masks when indoors, continues to virtually conduct activities which do not have to be held in person.

Our lodge hosted the 141st district's April 20 District School of Instruction (DSOI) during which the officers of Columbia Brotherhood No. 370, California No. 1, and San Francisco No. 120, met; were briefed by our Inspector, WB Allan Nubla, on the latest news and input from the Grand Lodge; shared information on each lodge's activities and events; and practiced degree work. Since the hosting lodge is responsible for performing the degree work our officers practiced the third degree opening, first section, and closing on April 13.

During our April Stated Meeting, Brother William Nichols Completed his proficiency in the lecture of the Entered Apprentice degree, and on June 15th he will be passed from the degree of Entered Apprentice Mason to the degree of Fellowcraft Mason .

We will hold our May Stated Meeting on Wednesday, May 4 **during which we will celebrate our Worshipful Brother Larry Di Giacomo and his 50 years of Masonic Service with the Golden Veteran's Award. The theme of our stated meeting dinner** will be Cinco De Mayo celebrating the Mexican army's May 5, 1862, defeat of Napoleon III's well-equipped, well maned French Imperial Army during its invasion of Mexico. This war occurred in Puebla, Mexico which was established between 800 and 200 B.C. and is considered the oldest continually inhabited city in Mexi-

co.¹ Many in the United States celebrate Cinco de Mayo because some evidence indicates that the success of the Mexican army delayed Napoleon III's plans to extend the French Army's invasion into the southern United States to join the confederate forces which could have changed the outcome of the US Civil war.²

Our Grand Master, Most Worshipful Jeffery M. Wilkins, via Grand Master Proclamation, has designated May 2022 as public awareness month. According to this proclamation, which can be found at < https://freemason.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/01/4_May_PublicAwareness.pdf>


"... An important aim of the 2025 Fraternity Plan is increasing awareness in our communities of the fraternity and the good work that Masons all over California do in their towns. to be proud of. It's time we share that pride with the outside world...."

Virtual Masonic Formation Classes are planned for Monday, May 9 and Monday, May 16. The beginning of the class will be spent discussing participant questions and selected topics. The second part of these classes will be focused on proficiency work.

Our officer team will participate in a District School of Instruction (DSOI) hosted by San Francisco No. 120 Lodge on Thursday, May 12; our officers and Past Masters will hold third-degree practice on May 18; and a team made up of our Past Masters will conduct a third-degree conferral on May 25.

We look forward to our families enjoying the last weekend of the month of May and doing that which brings them the most happiness and would like to point out a more somber occasion on Monday, May 30, Memorial Day. This tradition started after the US Civil War, (April 12, 1861 – April 9, 1865) first informally by ladies in Savannah, GA who cleaned and decorated the graves of fallen confederate soldiers and later by the May 5, 1868, General Order 11 issued by Brother John A Logan, 32nd degree and Commander-in-Chief, of the Grand Army of the Republic (a veteran group of former Union soldiers). This order designated "... May 30 as a Memorial Day for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country..."³

The referenced comrades were union soldiers who fought in the Civil war. This group has since been expended the men and women who died in military service for our country, and the day has been made a national holiday with a national moment of remembrance at 3:00 PM Eastern time on Memorial Day.⁴ Please consider participating in this informal observance, reflecting on the freedoms we enjoy and the people who paid the ultimate price that we may enjoy these freedoms.

by our fraternal brothers listed in this Trestle Board, several historic masonic events which took place in May are discussed below.




President William McKinley

The first degree of Masonry was conferred on William McKinley, the 25th President of the United States (1898-1901), in Hiram Lodge No. 21, Winchester, VA on May 1, 1865

Rudyard Kipling was passed to the degree of Fellowcraft on May 3, 1886.

On May 4, 1821, the Grand Lodges of Illinois was founded and the Grand Lodge of Missouri was formed.



Andrew Johnson

The first degree of Masonry was conferred on Andrew Johnson, the 17th President of the United States (1865-1869), in Greenville Lodge #119, Greenville, TN on May 5, 1851.

On May 8, 1843, a national Masonic Congress (a.k.a. the Baltimore Convention) convened in Baltimore, MD, in an attempt to establish a uniform ritual for Grand Lodges in the United States.

The Grand Lodge of West Virginia was formed on May 11, 1865.



On May 12; in 1932 the George Washington Masonic National Memorial in Alexandria, VA, was dedicated with thousands in attendance including President Herbert Hoover; in 1931 the first degree of Masonry was conferred on Arizona Senator and 1964 Presidential Candidate, Barry Goldwater in Arizona Lodge #2, Phoenix, AZ; in 1999 the Grand Lodge of D.C., Lead by Grand Master Dan L Frederick, voted to recognize the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of D.C.

The Grand Lodge of West Virginia was founded on May 16, 1866.

On May 17, 1921, High Twelve International was formed by E.C. Wolcott in Sioux City, IA. According to its website, <<https://freemasonryinformation.com/what-is-freemasonry/family-of-freemasonry/high-twelve/>>. High Twelve is an association of Master Masons dedicated to service to the fraternity, but who desire fellowship independent of the formal Lodge ritual.



Carl H. Claudy

On May 27, 1957, Carl H. Claudy, Masonic Author and Playwright, 1943 D.C. Grand Master, and Executive Secretary of Masonic Service Association of North America (MSA) completed his earthly duties.

On May 31, 1801, the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite for the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States, "Mother council of the world," was established in Charleston, SC.⁵
