

directed to the great Pythagoras, the famous ancient Greek philosopher, mathematician, and mystic, whose teachings and legacy have influenced many aspects of human knowledge and spirituality, including Freemasonry.

Pythagoras was also a philosopher who emphasized the study of numbers, music, and the harmony of the universe. 
