

points with a line, and connect the ends of that line to one of the vertices of the two circles, you will yield an equilateral triangle circumscribed within the *vesica piscis* created by the



intersection of the circles. What's even cooler is that you can perform this exercise with only a compass and a straight edge. This can also be proved in architecture, which by the way, is often used to begin basic plans.

One could also take the interpretation another direction, and think of the triangular figure known as the **Tetractys**.

JUNIOR WARDEN, ANIL AWASTI

It consists of ten points arranged into four rows, where the first row has one point, the second has two, the third three, and the fourth four.

This corresponds nicely to the magnitudes mentioned in the monitorial, as a "point" has only one point (forgive the circular definition), a line is comprised of two points, a *superfice* (or surface) extends the line into a third plane, and a fourth point can extend that plane into a solid.

This Tetractys dates way back through the ages to Pythagoreanism, dating back to the 6th century BC in what is now Southern Italy.

For adherents, they considered the symbol sacred and considered it as a model of the cosmos, where the monad (one) became the dyad (two), then the triad (three), and finally the tetrad (four). The

People all around the world celebrate Saint Patrick's Day in honor of the March 17 celebration which started when a feast day honoring patron St. Patrick was established by the Church in 1631. In observance of that tradition and to get a sense of Irish culture, we have chosen St. Patrick's Day as the theme for our March stated meeting on March 1<sup>st</sup>, we have invited the Murphy Irish Dancers to share their talent and

passion for Irish dance, and I have asked our Junior Warden to include a traditional Irish dinner of ham and colcannon as one of the dinner options. In past centuries, cattle in Ireland were kept and used for their strength and for milk production and were only slaughtered when they were too weak and or could not produce milk. Instead of using beef for meat, the Irish raised and consumed pigs, sheep, and poultry. In recent centuries, raising cattle for meat became part of the Irish economy, but a national Irish dish remains bacon and cabbage. Irish bacon is cut from the back of the pig as opposed to its belly, so it resembles what we in the United States refer to as ham.

MFC Classes will be offered on March 6 and March 20. Participants questions and seconddegree topics be discussed after which assistance will be offered for first-, second- and third-degree proficiencies. In addition, the officers will continue the 3<sup>rd</sup> degree ritual on March 8. Any third degree members are invited to attend.

Our officers will join the officers of California Lodge No. 1 and San Francisco Lodge 120 on March 16 during which San Francisco Lodge No. 120 will host the March district school of instruction (DSOI).

On March 27, Brother James Antony Dillon will have completed 50 years of service, so on March 22, officers will meet to practice for his Golden Veteran Award Ceremony planned on April 5<sup>th</sup> Stated Meeting. 
