2026 Dues

Greetings Brethren and families,

I hope everyone enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving. We truly have much to be grateful for. I also want to take a moment to once again thank the Brethren for entrusting me with the honor of serving as your Secretary.

The dues for 2026 are \$92.50.

Here are some answers to common questions I've received about paying dues this year.

Why am I receiving a notice from the Grand Lodge? We are participating in the Grand Lodge's dues notification program, where they handle all the printing and mailing of notices. This service helps the Lodge save significantly on printing and postage costs.

Do I have to pay online?

Not at all! While many brothers find paying online convenient and even have the option to set up automatic payments or renewals for future years, you are always welcome to pay directly to the Lodge by check.

They're saying there's a processing fee for online payments.

Yes, if you choose to pay by card, a small processing fee will be added. This fee goes directly to the credit card processor, and the Lodge receives the full amount of your dues. The Grand Lodge charges the Lodge nothing for this service.

Can I still pay with a check?

Absolutely! If you prefer to pay by check, you should be receiving a printed mailer soon, which might include a return envelope for your convenience.

Will you be mailing out dues cards?

Dues cards will be mailed upon request. Once your 2026 dues are paid, your new card will also be available online at www.freemason.org. You can download and print a valid copy or access a digital version on your mobile device for identification purposes.

Dues have increased, and I'm unable to pay them right now. What should I do?

Please reach out to me or the retention committee. If you're facing financial difficulties, we have the ability to remit (reduce or forgive) some or all of your dues. I'm happy to discuss this with you in confidence, so please don't hesitate to contact me by phone or email. Don't risk losing your good

standing in the Craft by ignoring your dues notice. We are here to help.

Is there something I haven't addressed?

If you have any questions I haven't answered, feel free to reach out. I'm always happy to hear from you!

Columbia Brotherhood Lodge No. 370 offered MFC meetings on Monday, November 10th and Monday, November 24th. Discussions included participant questions, Historical Masonic-associated events which occurred during the month of November, Lodge structure and operations and Geometry.

MFC Meetings will be dark in December and are planned to resume on Monday, January 12th and Monday, January 26th, 2026. Summaries of selected November MFC Meeting discussions are provided below.

Selected Masonic Events In November

In addition to Veterans Day and Thanksgiving, two selected events of Masonic significance in the United States, are discussed below.

On November 1, 1923, the official cornerstone was laid for the George Washington Masonic National Memorial, via a Masonic ceremony during which with President Calvin Coolidge used the same trowel that Washington used for cornerstone of the Capitol building.

On November 4, 1752, George Washington at the



age of twenty, was initiated an Entered Apprentice in the Lodge at Fredericksburg, Virginia. He is said to have paid two pounds and three shillings (approximately \$488 to \$596 in current

US Dollars) to join this Lodge. He was subsequently raised to the degree of Master Mason in 1753.

Brother John Philip Sousa, born November 6, 1854, sometimes called the "American March King" was the composer of "The Stars and Stripes Forever." He was a member of Hiram Lodge No. 10 in Washington D.C.

Brother Dr. James Naismith, the inventor of basketball, was born on November 6, 1861. He was an active Freemason, who served as Worshipful Master of Lawrence Lodge No. 6 in Kansas. He invented basketball in December 1891 while working as a physical education instructor at the International YMCA Training School in Springfield, Massachusetts. He created the game to give his students an indoor activity during the winter months, and the first game was played using a soccer ball and two peach baskets.

Brother Bram Stoker (11/8/1847-4/20/1912), Irish



Novelist and author of the novel, Dracula was born on November 8, 1847. He was a member of Buckingham and Chandos Lodge No. 1150 located in London, England. It was established during the late 1830s,

met at Freemasons' Hall on Great Queen Street, London, and is a member of the United Grand Lodge of England. Brother Stoker was initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason in February 1883, Passed to the degree of Fellow Craft in April 1883 and raised to the degree of Master Mason on June 20th, 1883.

On November 9TH, 1775, Brother James Monroe, the fifth U.S. President, was initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason at Williamsburg Lodge No. 6 in Virginia. He completed his degrees later in a military lodge while serving in the Continental Army.

The United States Marine Corps, also referred to as the United States Marines or simply the Marines, is the maritime land force service branch of the United States Department of Defense was founded on November 10th, 1775, in Philadelphia, PA

Veterans Day, also known as Remembrance Day and Armistice Day, observed November 11th, is particularly significant to Masons in many countries. Its Masonic themes include memory, ritual, and sacrifice.

Veteran's Day is celebrated on the anniversary of the armistice that ended World War I, with cessation of fighting beginning on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 and that ended World War I. It was originally named Armistice Day originally to commemorate the end of World War I, the "war to end all wars," but in the United States, the name was changed to Veterans Day in 1954 to honor all U.S. veterans of all wars.

The war officially ended with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles in June 1919, but the armistice date is recognized as the symbolic end of the fighting.

Remembrance Day is observed in other countries like Canada, Australia, and the United Kingdom to honor those who have died in conflict.

In the United States, Thanksgiving is celebrated on the fourth Thursday of November.

It is said that in 1621, the settlers from the Mayflower gathered in celebration to thank God for the harvest and for his many blessings. It is also said that members of the Wampanoag tribe in Plymouth, Massachusetts were also invited to the feast.

In 1789, President George Washington delivered the Proclamation of 1789 assigning November 26th as the National Holiday of Thanksgiving. This proclamation was also a symbol to our former monarchy that the colonies were a self-governing and legitimate state. Washington remarked, "both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness."

In the United States, the Thanksgiving holiday aligns with core Masonic principles of gratitude, charity, and community service. The cornucopia, one Thanksgiving symbol, is the jewel of the Senior and Junior Stewards and it can represent the abundance and generosity valued by the fraternity.

Lodge Structure and Operations from a Leadership Perspective

The leader of a Masonic lodge, the Worshipful Master, oversees all lodge activities, finances, and administration, and is an elected officer. He Oversees the administration, management, and direction of the lodge, manages finances, and plans events, serves as the primary point of contact between the lodge and the community, leads meetings and is in charge of and presides over ritual ceremonies, especially the Third Degree. He sits in the East of the east, chairs all of the business of his lodge, and is vested with considerable powers without further reference to the members. The Worshipful Master's jewel is the square.

The Senior Warden assists the Worshipful Master and is next in line to lead. He is responsible for the oversight of members during lodge hours, assists in the preparation of the Master's work in all degrees. He sits in the West and focuses on building knowledge and fostering growth within the lodge and oversees the education and formation of candidates, ensuring their journey is meaningful and rooted in Masonic values. The Senior Warden's jewel is the level.

The Junior Warden is responsible for the welfare of the brethren during Lodge hours. He oversees food arrangements and catering for lodge events and dinners. He is the third of the principal officers and is charged with the supervision of the Lodge while it is "at refreshment." The Jewel of the Junior Warden is the Plumb.

The Treasurer Manages all financial transactions for the lodge, receives all money including money collected by the secretary, pays debts, and provides financial reports. He maintains accurate and detailed financial records, using a ledger and other accounting software or methods and prepares and presents regular financial reports to the Worshipful Master and the lodge members. The Treasurer sits to the right of the Worshipful Master in the East, and the Jewel of the Treasurer is a pair of keys.

The Secretary handles all administrative duties, including correspondence, minutes, and member records, compiles the list of new candidates and tracks their progress, communicates with other lodges and the Grand Lodge. The Secretary sits to the left of the Worshipful Master in the East, and the Jewel of the Secretary is a pair of quills.

The Chaplain Leads spiritual matters for the lodge and delivers prayers at the opening and closing of meetings and during ceremonies Chaplain sits directly to the left of the Worshipful Master in the East, and the Jewel of the Chaplain is an image of a book of holy writings, typically the Bible.

The Senior Deacon Acts as a messenger for the Worshipful Master, carrying orders to the Senior Warden, guides candidates during degree rituals, opens and closes the Bible to the correct passage for the degree, communicates messages, prepares candidates during ceremonies. The Senior Deacon Sits to the right of the Worshipful Master and his jewel is a square and compass with a sun.

The Junior Deacon acts as a messenger for the Senior and Junior Wardens, controls access to the lodge room by guarding the inner door, assists the Senior Deacon in ritualistic work, ensures the lodge is properly secured ("tiled"), communicates messages, prepares candidates during ceremonies, ensures only qualified members enter the lodge. The Junior Deacon Sits to the right of the Senior Warden, and his jewel is a square and compass with a moon.

The Marshall's ceremonial responsibilities including escorting dignitaries and managing processions. His hospitality tasks include welcoming visitors, supporting the Master in various administrative and organizational functions, and giving the candidate challenge. The Marshall sits in the east in front of the Secretary, and his jewel is a pair of batons.

The Senior and Junior Stewards are responsible for hospitality and for assisting with degree ceremonies. They may help with setting up chairs and preparing and serving refreshments for meetings, leading the "Festive Board," selling raffle tickets, and generally fostering fellowship. They are often junior members, and the role serves as a way to learn lodge operations and get to know members. The Stewards sit in the South in front of the Junior Warden, and their jewels are cornucopias.

The Tiler guards the door of the Lodge, ensuring only properly qualified Masons are admitted, prepares the lodge room before meetings and secure it afterward, admits those arriving after verifying their credentials, and prevents "cowans" and "eavesdroppers" (unqualified individuals) from entering, and symbolically guarding the privacy and sanctity of the Lodge. The Tiler sits in the Lodge Entry Door, and his jewel is a sword.


