

From the East

WORSHIPFUL MASTER, JAMES GONZALEZ



Brothers and Ladies,

With the advent of the autumnal equinox, in anticipation of autumn activities, and the beginning of the year's fourth quarter, I send you greetings from the east.

The autumnal equinox which occurred on the 22nd of September is the day on which the number of nighttime hours equals the number of daytime hours. This date is the midpoint between the summer solstice on June 21st and the winter Solstice on December 21st. It also falls at a midpoint between St John's Feast Day on June 24th and St John's Day on December 27th. These dates associate with the parallel lines representing St John the Baptist and St John the Evangelist and with the Freemason symbol of point within a circle. It has also been said that relationships can exemplify a point on a Mason's

journey, a point of balance and harmony which allows reflection on the progress he has made in quest to be a better man, a time to be grateful for the bounties experienced during this year, and a time to look forward and prepare for the renewal and transformation during the ensuing masonic year.

Our current efforts involve the work needed to complete this masonic year, to prepare for the annual communications meeting for the California Grand Lodge, and to prepare in so many ways for the ensuing Masonic year. 


